#### **08/42 MINUTES**

#### 08/44 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr Taylor declared a personal interest as she knew the applicant for a Community Development grant to the Cambridge Diamonds referred to in the officer's report.

All members present declared personal interests as County Councillor Kent, who had commented in her capacity as a local resident on planning application 9.3 08/1141/FUL, was also a member of the Committee although she was not present at the meeting.

#### 08/46 OPEN FORUM

# Q1 Play Area on the Brooklands Ave development (Accordia Development)

The handover of the play area on the Brooklands Ave development has been delayed by the presence of yews on the site. What is the current situation, which

developer is responsible for that part of the site and how much would it cost to replace the yews with something less poisonous.

- A Cllr Blackhurst said that as the resident had supplied the text of the question before the meeting, it had been possible to obtain further information from Cllr Blair who had recently attended a meeting on site and had prepared a briefing note which the residents present were welcome to have.
- **Q2** We hope that City Council officials will attend the next meeting to explain to us why £9bn of public funds our money was invested in a bank backed by an economy the size of Brighton.

Secondly, what action is being taken against the City Treasurer and his advisers? We hope they are being encouraged to move on, and WITHOUT a compensation package.

A Cllr Blackhurst said that, again, as the resident had supplied the text of the question before the meeting, it had been possible to obtain further information from the Director of Finance which he read out to the meeting. He said that the Director was preparing a report on this issue for the Council's Strategy and Resources Scrutiny Committee on 17 November. This was an open meeting which residents could attend and ask further questions.

# 08/47 OPPORTUNITIES FOR FUTURE IMPROVEMENTS AT CHERRY HINTON HALL PARK

Alistair Wilson from Active Communities spoke on proposals for the development of the Cherry Hinton Hall Park.

The project was designed to address the current perceptions of users and nonusers of Cherry Hinton Hall, understand how it was used, clarify satisfaction with current provision and discuss aspirations and future need.

It was the intention to consult broadly on this subject, gathering as many views as possible and as a consequence of this discussion, work up solutions and ideas for further consideration.

The key groups of people who needed to be consulted further on this project had been identified as

- Local residents;
- Stakeholder groups with an interest in the park or its buildings/functions;
- And Local young people.

The list of stakeholders was reviewed and amended by Ward Councillors in the week commencing 15 September 2008 and concluded on 22 September 2008.

To help gather participants' feedback it was proposed to work in small groups. It

was felt this would be very effective in considering options through Planning for Real type work. This method of working had proved very effective at detailing ideas and concepts for the Jesus Green Improvements Project.

Each group would comprise no more than twelve people. These would take part in discussion groups that would use a map/model of the locality to carry out specific tasks.

The timeline for the project would culminate in a report to South Area Committee on 12th February 2009 and a recommendations to the Executive Councillor for Arts and Recreation at the meeting of the Community Services Scrutiny Committee on 12 March 2009.

Members said that the further consideration should be given to development of the Hall and that the information on the proposals could be disseminated more widely.

Members noted the arrangements for the consultation process.

#### 08/48 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT SCHEMES

The Principal Landscape Architect reported on schemes which required decision and updated members on those which were in progress. Members noted the updated budget which showed that balance of the current year's budget as £205,615.

Debate In discussion of the application, members felt that the

proposal raised a number of concerns including the extensive resurfacing of the access would change the nature of the environment and be detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood, the access itself would provide a hazard to traffic from inevitable increase in use

of the facility.

#### **Decision**

**Refused, against Officer recommendation,** by 5 votes to 1, for the reasons outlined above and at the meeting and agreed by the Chair and Spokesperson subsequently as follows:

- 1. The covering of a very substantial proportion of the surface of the site with gravel, which although found locally is not found in anything like the quantity and manner proposed here, is not informed by the characteristics of the locality, and responds poorly to the features of natural and local character on and close to the application site. Notwithstanding the planting proposed by this application, the extent of the gravel proposed would adversely affect one of the attractive lateral views from Latham Road, and diminish the rural quality of the street, having an adverse impact on the character and appearance of the conservation area and detracting from the amenity of the urban edge, contrary to policies 3/2, 3/4 and 4/11 of the Cambridge Local Plan 2006.
- 2. The provision of 19 gravel surface car parking spaces hard up against the common boundary with No 7 Latham Road would, both through the increased noise from the surface, and because they would encourage more frequent use of the area for car parking, parking closer to the boundary, and the occupation of the area by more cars, have a harmful impact on the residential amenity of the occupiers of the adjacent property, contrary to policy 3/4 of the Cambridge Local Plan 2006...
