Addenbrooke's Access Road

In response to a request from Committee members, John Clough, Project Manager for Addenbrookes' Access Road attended the meeting to share the plans for the junction of the access road to Addenbrookes. He explained the plans, responded to questions and comments and said that he would be willing to come back to the Committee's next meeting in if members thought it would be helpful to them and to residents.

Q Bollards at Rathmore Road

Following another incident yesterday where a vehicle, presumably a lorry, had reversed into a wall at Rathmore Road partly demolishing it. What was the Council proposing to do about the continued danger to pedestrians if the bollards were not going to be installed..

A Cllr Baker reminded the meeting that the work to install bollards had been agreed but the County Council had expressed some concerns, which had caused the delay in implementation.

Dinah Foley-Norman, the Principal Landscape Architect, said that the County were reluctant to add to the street clutter in that area. She offered to discuss the problem with the residents and explain how the issue might be pursued with the County Council.

Another said the Police had been unable to act without evidence as to the driver of the vehicle that had caused the damage.

Q Progress on the Guided Bus

What progress was being made on the Guided Bus? When would the service be operational. Residents understood it to be beginning at the end of this year. A Cllr Baker said the latest estimate for starting the service in the Southern half of the route was later next year. Other members and residents had different understandings.

09/34 Policing and Safer Neighbourhood Report

Sergeant Morgenthaler referred to the report and the actions taken in respect of the priorities previously identified.

- Effectively tackle speeding on Queen Edith's Way through education and enforcement.
- Tackle crime and disorder in New Town and increase confidence of that community in key agencies
- Tackle anti-social use of mini motos across the neighbourhood
 The Police had been engaged in a number of areas in addition to those selected as priorities. These included:
- The Neighbourhood Police Team have been involved in a number of open days at Parkside Police Station and Purbeck House, and had been in attendance at a number of events.
- Combating anti-social behaviour in the area of Cherry Hinton Chalk pits by people wanting to use the area as a beach with the associated risks to those that chose to mix swimming with alcohol.
- Taking part in the Council's Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) Team monthly surgeries in Trumpington since March 2009 to encourage people to come forward and report ASB. This resulted in various actions arising from reports.

Cllr Stuart asked about the anti-social behaviour, referred to at a previous meeting, on the problems of ASB identified in the Norfolk Street area. Alastair Roberts, Safer Communities Manager responded to the comments and undertook to provide further information following the meeting.

Sgt Morgenthaler responded to questions from members and the public covering the following points:

Speed checks on Queen Edith's Way Monitoring of the use of Cherry Hinton Chalk Pits Anti Social Behaviour in Wolfson Way The dangers to public safety of emergency vehicles speeding.

Members considered the recommendations for priorities for the next reporting period and approved the following:

- Tackling Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in and around Cherry Hinton Hall. To tackle the issues of mopeds and ASB in the grounds of Cherry Hinton
 Hall with particular attention to damage that may be caused to the play
 area.
- 2. Reducing Cycle theft at Addenbrookes Hospital. To tackle the issues of cycle theft and promote cycle security.
- Tackling ASB in Anstey Way/Paget Rd/Foster Rd. To tackle the issues of youth ASB and groups of youths causing residents to fear ASB.

09/35 Review of Gambling Statement of Principles – Public Consultation

The Licensing Manager explained the background to the revised draft Statement of Principles as a part of the public consultation process and invite members and residents feedback on its content, prior to the drawing up of a final statement. She invited members and members of the public to submit any written comments by 28 September 2009. The Statement of Principles was available on the Council's website.

09/36 Environmental Improvements Programme

The Landscape Architect reported on the progress with approved schemes and on one scheme which required approval.

In response to a question from Cllr Newbold she confirmed that the third phase of the Cherry Hinton Forecourt scheme was in hand and had been omitted in error from the report.
