3 APPROVED SCHEMES – PROGRESS

3.1 Sedley Taylor/Luard Road potential traffic calming

A topographic survey has been carried out at the junction with Long Road to enable draft proposals to be drawn up. They will now be discussed with County Highways.

3.2 Foster Road Allotments

All works have been completed apart from a small amount of herbaceous and bulb planting which will be carried out later in the autumn.

3.3 Lighting to Walkway from Bishop's Court to Hauxton Road

Request for lighting along an unadopted walkway used to access Trumpington P&R and Waitrose from Bishop's Court. Officers are investigating responsibility for ongoing maintenance and revenue costs for the lighting as well as a formal liability agreement with the private landowner.

It has been established that S106 monies are not available for this scheme. We are therefore progressing this project as an EIP funded scheme.

Officers are at present talking to Safer Communities to find out whether there is another avenue of revenue funding.

3.4 Queen Edith's Way Grass Verges

To re-instate the grass verges along Queen Edith's Way from Wulfstan Way to the roundabout with Mowbray Road and Fendon Road. Re-seeding is to be carried out shortly.

3.5 Gladstone Way barrier

Finding a solution that is acceptable to residents, County Highways and DDA compliant is proving challenging.

3.6 Hanging baskets - Cherry Hinton High Street

The structural load testing of the existing lighting columns along Cherry Hinton High Street has been ordered to ascertain whether they can accommodate two number hanging baskets each next summer.

3.7 Pinch Points

Proposed pinch points to be removed are as follows:

Orchard Estate – Cycle Officers are being re-consulted to ensure proposals acceptable following a query from a local resident. Construction anticipated in October/November.

3.8 Mobility Crossings

Confirmation that the following mobility crossings have been constructed:

- Nightingale Avenue /Hills Road
- Exit of car park to Colville Road
- Mill End Road/Forest Road
- Mill End Road/Desmond Avenue
- Mill End Road

4 SCHEMES REQUIRING DECISIONS

4.1 Additional parking in Chalfont Close

Public consultation for this scheme has been carried out and has been positively supported including the removal and replacement of adjacent tree planting. The consultation analysis can be seen in Appendix 1.

Recommendation: Committee is asked to authorise the implementation of the additional parking at an estimated cost of £24,500.

Decision: to authorise implementation of the scheme at an estimated cost of £24,500.

4.2 Church End Parking area

The trial pits to precisely locate utilities have been carried out. Designs can now be drawn up and approval in principal can be sought from County Highways. The scheme could then go to public consultation following approval in principal by the Project Councillor.

Recommendation: Committee to authorise public consultation as soon as possible following approval in principal by the Project Councillor and County Highways.

Decision: to authorise public consultation.

4.4 Environmental Improvement Projects priority

At the previous meeting in August, South Area Committee agreed that officers should give the following priority to current projects:

- 1. Chalfont Close additional parking.
- 2. Sedley Taylor/Luard Road traffic calming.
- 3. Church End parking verge.
- 4. Walkway from Bishops Court to Hauxton Rd Lighting.
- 5. Gladstone Way barrier.

In line with a decision made earlier this year, all Area Committees are being asked to agree and/or confirm individual Project Councillors for their current and potential projects:

South Area Committee are asked to agree and/or confirm individual Project Councillors for the following current projects:

- Chalfont Close additional parking.
- Sedley Taylor/Luard Road traffic calming.
- Church End parking verge.
- Walkway from Bishops Court to Hauxton Rd Lighting.
- Gladstone Way barriers.
- Cherry Hinton hanging baskets.
- Queen Ediths Way grass verges.
- Cherry Hinton High Street shop forecourts (west side).

Recommendation: Officers recommend that Committee agree/confirm Project Councillors for current projects.

Decision: Agree/confirm Project Councillors for current projects.

5 NEW PROJECT TO BE CONSIDERED

5.1 Blackland Allotments, Cherry Hinton

The committee of Blackland Allotment have applied for a Community Development Grant for £350 for a grass cutter and £175 for a skip to clear rubbish from the site. Officers suggest that the rubbish skip element of the application may be more appropriately funded from the Environmental Improvement budget.

Recommendation: Officers recommend that Committee agree to fund the cost of a rubbish skip for the allotment.

Decision: Agree to fund the cost of a rubbish skip at a cost of £175.

7.1 It is the role of this Area Committee to ensure that an appropriate level of consultation is carried out and where necessary to make decisions about what changes to make to a scheme following consultation.

7 IMPLICATIONS



- 2. Would like to see the Holm Oak removed/pruned: 38% of respondents.
