3.0 APPROVED SCHEMES: PROGRESS

3.1 Penny Ferry, The Haling Way

The tree planting is 95% complete; a small inaccessible area remains, which will be dealt with shortly.

3.2 Nun's Way Parking Area Refurbishment

Construction is currently underway and is due to be complete by the end of March.

3.3 Campkin Road Verges

Final approvals are currently being sort from the Highway Authority and construction is expected to commence in early March.

3.4 Riverside Cycle Conflict Reduction and EIP Scheme

The scheme was approved at Environment Scrutiny Committee on 12 January and, following Full Council on 25 February, work will recommence on the final detailing design with construction expected to commence during the summer and completion by the end of the year.

3.5 Garry Drive Verge Planting

A planting design is currently being produced along with installation costs. We are also liaising with the County Council to gain the necessary approvals for a scheme within the highway. This scheme will be presented to the Committee in April for approval to implement subject to public consultation.

4.0 EXISTING SCHEMES THAT REQUIRE DECISIONS

4.1 Campkin Road Shop Forecourts

A detailed design is now complete for this scheme. The drawing in appendix one of this report illustrates the proposed layout and design elements.

The whole area of the forecourt will be fully reconstructed to new levels with improved drainage, including an area of block paving outside the shop itself. Street furniture will be replaced including benches, bollards, bins and cycle racks.

The existing trees will be replaced with two new semi-mature specimens planted within 5m diameter raised tree pits incorporating additional planting. A concrete ring will be cast below ground around the perimeter of the tree pit to ensure that the existing problem of tree roots damaging the surrounding surfacing does not reoccur.

The existing granite setts within the old tree pits will be relayed around the new tree pits and along the edge of the asphalt areas.

The improvements to the surrounding highway verges and footways will be delivered as part of the Campkin Rd Verges scheme once we have the necessary approvals from the Highway Authority.

Breakdown of scheme costs:

Civils Work - £57,192

Full reconstruction of all paved areas off the public highway.

New and widened footpath access to the forecourt from St Kilda Avenue.

Block paving directly outside the shop facade.

Construction of a root barrier system around the new trees and landscaped areas.

Landscaping Work - £13,750

Two new semi-mature trees.

Planting of new extended landscaped areas.

Street Furniture - £15,681

Knee Rail, Bins, Bollards, Benches and Cycle Racks

Street Lighting Improvements - £1,200

Improvements to surrounding footway and highway verges - £7,954

10% Contingency - £9,577

TOTAL SCHEME BUDGET COST - £105,354

An additional optional extra for this scheme includes the installation of silva cell, a system that would provide an improved growing medium for the newly planted trees. This system is somewhat untested in the UK and is designed to make more significant improvements to growing conditions beneath surfaces that are trafficked. This is not the case in this instance and along with the historic issues with roots damaging the surface paving, it is felt that a traditional approach to controlling tree root growth is more appropriate. There is also the significant additional cost of £39,000 for the silva cell system, which brings into serious question the cost benefit of installing this system. Officers therefore do not recommend that it is included within the proposed scheme.

Recommendation: That Committee authorise the implementation of the scheme at a cost of £105,354.

Decision: To approve the scheme for implementation at a cost of £105,354.

5.0 NEW SCHEMES TO BE CONSIDERED

At the North Area Committee EIP workshop held on Monday 4 February the list of deferred or newly suggested schemes was discussed. 

APPENDIX 3

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA - as agreed by Executive Councillor (Environment) on 18 March 2003 with amendments agreed 22 March 2005

The essential criteria for consideration of funding of Environmental Improvement works are:

- Schemes should have a direct, lasting and noticeable improvement to the appearance of a street or area.
- Schemes should be publicly visible and accessible.
- Schemes must have the owners consent if on private land unless there are exceptional circumstances by which Area Committee may wish to act unilaterally and with full knowledge and responsibility for the implication of such action.
- Schemes must account for future maintenance costs.

Desirable criteria – potential schemes should be able to demonstrate some level of:

- Active involvement of local people.
- Benefit for a large number of people.
- 'Partnership' funding.
- Potential for inclusion of employment training opportunities.
- Ease and simplicity of implementation.
- Potential for meeting key policy objectives (e.g. improving community safety or contributing to equal opportunities).

Categories of scheme ineligible for funding:

- Where a readily available alternative source of funding is available.
- Revenue projects.
- Schemes that have already received Council funding (unless it can be clearly demonstrated that this would not be 'top up' funding).
- Works that the City or County Council are under an immediate obligation to carry out (e.g. repair of dangerous footways)
- Play areas (as there are other more appropriate sources of funding including \$106 monies)

The following categories of work were agreed as being eligible for funding by the Area Committees:

- Works in areas of predominately council owned housing
- Works to construct lay-bys where a comprehensive scheme can be carried out which not only relieves parking problems but achieves environmental improvements.
