This has now been somewhat overtaken by the widespread County review of parking and I think this area has been identified as one with potential for a resident's parking scheme. On that basis, Cllr Whitehead I think suggested we might defer our work. We are currently thinking through the implications of this and a number of other legacy projects that have proven difficult to develop and deliver for a follow up discussion with councillors in the wards affected, prior to reporting to the winter round of Area Committees where new scheme allocations will be considered.

There was a traffic regulation order for the whole of Peterborough City Centre that could be only be activated and enforced in a certain area following the certain process. Local residents in a road had to request an order and then a series of informal consultations with Councillors and residents would follow. A questionnaire and a vote would then take place; 50% of residents had to vote with 70% of those 50% in favour to make it possible for the order to go ahead. The order could also be activated by a request from emergency services and if the area was being used for nuisance purposes such as selling a vehicle which had been left over a period of time. The main focus in Peterborough was parking on the grass verge.
