		<p>fall within the jurisdiction of the police. Under section 1 of the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991, Possessing, breeding, selling, exchanging or advertising a prohibited dog (There are only 4 types of prohibited breeds: Pit Bull Terrier, Japanese Tosa, Dogo Argentino and Fila Brasileiro). This offence carries a sentence of up to six months' imprisonment.</p> <p>Also allowing a dog to be dangerously out of control (s3 Dangerous Dogs Act 1991) - This offence is wide ranging; it applies to all breeds/types, not just prohibited breeds (a common misconception) and can be committed in a public or private space (including your own home or garden). It also applies to both the owner and the person in charge of the dog (if different). This offence carries a sentence of up to six months imprisonment and an unlimited fine, although if it is aggravated then the penalties are significantly higher: if death is caused, the penalty is up to 14 years' imprisonment; if a person is injured, up to five years' imprisonment; and three years' imprisonment for an aggravated attack on an assistance dog. this also includes banned breeds (as above) under the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991.</p>
