## **Explanatory Statement**

The agenda provides members with an update on transport issues in respect of Cambridge Biomedical Campus (CBC) and discharges an action arising from the South Area Committee meeting on June 4.

As previously outlined, this item did not go ahead on June 4 given key representatives from Cambridgeshire County Council and the Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) had not been confirmed to attend. It was resolved to address the item at a special meeting of the SAC.

Subsequent discussions between the SAC Chair, Vice Chair and Council/GCP representatives concluded that, in light of the announcement of the postponement of Papworth Hospital's imminent move to CBC and in order to avoid the peak summer holiday period, it was appropriate to reschedule the item for the next SAC meeting on September 10.

In the intervening period, the SAC Vice Chair has liaised with SAC members and local residents groups to identify key issues and concerns relating to the south of the city and these have been shared as a briefing note with guest speakers.

Further, to add value, GCP agreed to hold a drop-in session to share information and for people to speak to relevant transport officers immediately prior to SAC between 6pm and 7pm in the venue foyer.
