# Full fibre is coming to Cambridge

Over the next two years, CityFibre will be investing £20 million in Cambridge, installing a citywide Fibre-to-the-Home (FTTH) network.

The investment aims to connect almost all businesses, public sector organisations and homes in Cambridge to full fibre broadband. Currently, only 6% of the UK's population has access to full fibre broadband. CityFibre's investment will make Cambridge one of the most digitally connected cities in the world, allowing gigafast speeds of up to 900 Megabits per second.

#### When is this happening?

The planning phase is currently under way. Work is expected to begin late spring 2019 starting in the north of the City (Arbury, King's Hedges and Chesterton) and expand from there. The entire City network should be complete within two years.

#### What are the benefits to homeowners?

The investment will provide game-changing gigabit-speed broadband to residents in their homes, transforming user experience with seamless multi-device streaming, buffer-free video calling and real-time gaming, as well as supporting the adoption of flexible working practices and emerging internet enabled technologies.

#### What will this mean for residents?

Most of the new full fibre network will be laid underground, which will require construction crews digging trenches which will cause some disruption. However, the teams work quickly and each individual property should only be inconvenienced for a few days. CityFibre is working in partnership with Vodafone to offer a new service. Once a property has been passed and a connection made possible, residents will be contacted by Vodafone to explain how to connect if wished.

#### How will I know when you will be in my street?

A team of "door-knockers" will go around a neighbourhood two weeks before work commences speaking to residents and leaving information. In the week before work commences further communication takes place, particularly related to car parking. During construction the teams will be clearly identified and will seek to minimise disruption to residents.




#### What is full fibre and why do we need it?
