A range of licence terms and conditions regulate the use of the space and whether or not permission is granted.

- Where agencies may exercise their own statutory decision-making authority it is stressed that this is the determination of that authority and not of the Cambridge City SAG.
- The <u>overall responsibility</u> for the safety of persons at an event will lie with the event organiser, venue/land owner or operator and management team
