19/16/NAC Matters arising - Asked whether a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) had been considered or put in place	Cllr Todd-Jones	Response from Highways England: A Traffic Regulation Order (and in this case it would have to be for a limited time, hence a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order) is an order to enforce a particular traffic regulation which in the context of the issue to be dealt with would be an order applying a temporary application of a weight restriction. Considerable consideration has been given to having a temporary weight restriction on Histon Road to help prevent self-diverting HGV's using the road during night time closures of the A14. While it may seem a good idea at face value, in practical terms unless it is vigorously enforced by the enforcing authority (ie The Police) it is actually ineffective as we have found elsewhere along the scheme. And the Police constantly state that their resources are limited and their priorities are elsewhere.
