## Licensing Act 2003 - Licensing Sub-Committee: Hearings Procedure

### Preliminary Matters

1. **The Chair** will commence the hearing by introducing him/herself, the other two members of the Sub-Committee and the officers present.
2. **The Chair** will ask the applicant(s)/the responsible authorities/the interested parties present, and their representatives (if applicable), to introduce themselves and identify their interest in the proceedings.

### Failure of a party to attend the hearing

3. If a party has informed the licensing authority that he/she does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his/her absence.
4. If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing, the Sub-Committee may –
  - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
  - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
5. Where the Sub-Committee holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the Sub-Committee will consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
6. **The Chair** will explain the procedure to be followed at the hearing and will confirm whether the Sub-Committee must reach its decision at the end of the hearing or within 5 working days of the hearing, depending on the application being heard.
7. **The Clerk to the Sub-Committee** will indicate whether any party has requested permission for any other person(s) (other than his/her representative) to appear at the hearing to assist the Sub-Committee in relation to the application, representations or notice of the party making the request. The Sub-Committee will decide whether to grant permission to allow any other person(s) to appear at the hearing on behalf of the party; such permission will not be unreasonably withheld.
8. **The Clerk to the Sub-Committee** will ask whether any party is seeking to introduce any document(s) or other information not previously disclosed to all the other parties to the hearing and the licensing authority. If all the other parties consent, the previously undisclosed document(s) or other information can be produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable).
9. The hearing will take the form of a discussion led by the Chair of the Sub-Committee. Cross-examination will not be permitted unless the Sub-Committee considers that cross-examination is required to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
10. The Sub-Committee will consider any requests to permit cross-examination on

a case-by-case basis. When permission is given to one party, it will also normally be extended to all other parties.

11. The Sub-Committee will decide the equal maximum period of time that each party will have to present their case.

## **The Hearing**

12. *The Licensing Officer will present the report to the Sub-Committee.*

13. Members may ask any relevant questions of the Licensing Officer.

14. *The applicant, or the party who has initiated the hearing, will present their case first.*

15. The party shall be entitled to:

(a) give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) in response to a specific request by the licensing authority prior to the hearing;

(b) question any other party (if permission has been given by the Sub-Committee);

(c) address the Sub-Committee.

16. If the Police are a party to the hearing, they will present their case. The Police have the rights listed in paragraph 15 (a) – (c) above.

17. If any other “responsible authority” are a party to the hearing, they will present their case in turn after the Police and have the rights listed in paragraph 15 (a) – (c) above.

18. Any other interested parties will then present their case in turn and have the rights listed in paragraph 15 (a) – (c) above.

19. Members of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of the/each party or any other person permitted to appear at the hearing in support of the party.

20. **The Chair** will invite the applicant, or the party who has initiated the hearing, and any parties making representations, to briefly summarise their points if they wish.

21. **The Chair** will ask the applicant, or the party who has initiated the hearing, and all parties making representations, that they are satisfied that they have said all they wish to.

## **The Decision**

22. In considering any representations or notice made by a party, the Sub-Committee may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.

23. In reaching its decision, the Sub-Committee will disregard any information given by a party, or any person who has been permitted to appear at the hearing, which is not relevant to –

(a) the application, representations or notice (as applicable) or in the case of another person, the application, representations or notice of the party

requesting their appearance, and

(b) the promotion of the licensing objectives or, in relation to a hearing to consider a notice given by the Police, the crime prevention objective.

24. The Sub-Committee may consider its decision in private and may move into private session where it considers that the public interest in so doing outweighs the public interest in that part of the hearing taking place in public. If the Sub-Committee do move into private session then all the parties and their representatives, any other person permitted to appear at the hearing, officers, the public and the press will be asked to leave the room whilst the decision is made.

**The Chair** will tell those present at the meeting the decision taken by the Sub-Committee and the reasons for the decision.

**CONSIDERATION OF AN APPLICATION TO REVIEW A PREMISES  
LICENCE: STEVENSONS FLOATING RIVER BAR, STREET RECORD,  
QUAYSIDE, CAMBRIDGE**

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### 1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 An application under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for a Review of a Premises Licence in respect of Stevensons Floating River Bar, Street Record, Quayside, Cambridge has been received from The Conservators of the River Cam. The application, which is attached to the report as Appendix A was served on Cambridge City Council (the Licensing Authority) on 8 October 2015. A copy of the application was also served on each responsible authority.
- 1.2 The applicant is seeking a review of the premises licence for the reasons outlined in the application (Appendix A).
- 1.3 In accordance with the regulations of the Act, the application was advertised on the premises and at the Licensing Authority Office, Mandela House, 4 Regent Street, Cambridge, CB2 1BY to invite representations from responsible authorities and other persons. The last date for submitting representations was 24 November 2015.
- 1.4 Representations have been received from one Responsible Authority, Cambridge City Council Licensing Department. The representation is attached to the report as Appendix B.
- 1.5 The application is therefore yet to be determined.

## **2. RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 2.1 That Members determine the application on its individual merits having reference to the statutory licensing objectives and Cambridge City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

## **3. BACKGROUND**

- 3.1 An application for a Premises Licence was granted in respect of these premises on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2012. The Premises Licence was transferred to the current licence holder, Sarah Stevenson, on 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2013. The current licence is attached to the report as Appendix C.
- 3.2 In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority must have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and additionally the statutory guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The relevant sections from the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy are:
- Objectives, section 2
  - Fundamental principles, section 4
  - Licensing Hours, section 6
  - Licence Conditions, section 8

## **4. CONSULTATIONS**

- 4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires applications made under section 51 of the Act to be served on the Responsible Authorities and also advertised on the premises and at the main Licensing Authority office. During the consultation period, Responsible Authorities and Other Persons (any individual, body or business entitled to make representations to licensing authorities) may make a representation in respect of the application.
- 4.2 Statutory consultation has therefore taken place in accordance with the procedures set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and associated regulations made under the Act.

## **5. OPTIONS**

- 5.1 Whilst having reference to the information provided by the applicant and the representations and also Cambridge City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Sub-Committee's decision must

be made with a view to promoting one or more of the four licensing objectives, namely:

- (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
- (b) public safety;
- (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
- (d) the protection of children from harm.

5.2 Members should take such steps that they consider are necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee may resolve:

- (a) to leave the licence as it is;
- (b) to modify the conditions of the licence;
- (c) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- (d) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- (e) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- (f) to revoke the licence.

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added (Licensing Act 2003 section 52 (4)).

## **6. CONCLUSIONS**

6.1 The Licensing Authority has a duty under the Licensing Act 2003 to promote the Licensing Objectives. Each objective has equal importance. In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority must also have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy, and the Statutory Guidance under the Licensing Act 2003 and it is bound by the Human Rights Act 1998. The Council must also fulfil its obligations under Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to do all that it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in Cambridge.

## **7. IMPLICATIONS**

### **a) Financial Implications**

Cambridge City Council (the Licensing Authority) has a statutory duty to determine applications made under the Licensing Act 2003. The application fees associated with such applications are set by Central Government and are intended to cover the cost of administering the licensing regime.

There are no specific financial implications associated with this report.

(b) **Staffing Implications**

There are no staffing implications associated with this report.

(c) **Equal Opportunities Implications**

No Equality Impact Assessment has been conducted as the only consideration in reaching a decision is whether the granting of the application will undermine the statutory licensing objectives.

(d) **Environmental Implications**

Any environmental implications that need to be considered must specifically relate to the promotion of the statutory licensing objectives and will be contained in the representations made by the responsible authorities or interested parties.

(e) **Community Safety**

Cambridge Constabulary, Cambridgeshire Fire & Rescue Service, Cambridge City Council's Environmental Health Team, Cambridge City Council's Planning Service, Cambridgeshire County Council's Child Protection & Review Unit, Cambridgeshire County Council's Trading Standards Department and the Public Health Director were consulted as part of the application process and could have made representation if they supported the review of the premises licence.

Those making representations would have raised any relevant community safety implications.

We are the navigation authority for Cambridge and have significant concerns about this license.

One of the conditions is that the "License holder must not cause an obstruction to navigation".

The Backs where the punt operates as a floating bar is extremely busy during peak periods and this year there were several serious incidents involving collisions.

Our observation is that the places that this premise operates regularly cause an obstruction to navigation and increase the likelihood of collisions.

Further more this punt has been observed carrying members of the public and fare-paying passengers on a regular basis.

The punt was also involved in a serious collision that caused serious injury to a member of the public.

Currently we have removed this punt from the River due to all these concerns and would like to see a review of this license as we no longer believe it is a safe or appropriate premise on the Backs.

**Licence Review**

I refer to the review of the premises licence for Stevensons Floating River Bar, reference PRECAM000628, raised by the Conservators of the River Cam.

**Comments on the Review of the Premises Licence**

Licensing supports the review of the premises licence for the Stevensons River Bar as there are problems with the current licence.

I suggest the following conditions to ensure the premises licence meets the licensing objectives.

**SUGGESTED ADDITIONAL CONDITION**

1. Within 3 months of the hearing Miss Stevenson, the Licence Holder, must notify the Licensing Team of Cambridge City Council of the registration number of the punt that is licensed. The premises licence will then be issued with this as the premises licensed.
2. The supply of alcohol shall only be from the punt with the registration number in part 1 of this premises licence.

3. The licensed punt shall display the following wording on both sides of the bow and on the till so it can be read from the stern. "Stevensons Floating River Bar," this shall be in letters at least 50 mm (2") high, below this there shall be the name of the Licence Holder and the following wording, "licensed to supply alcohol," this shall be in letters at least 25 mm (1") high. e.g.

## **Stevensons Floating River Bar**

**Miss Sarah Louise Stevenson, licensed to supply alcohol**

Supply of alcohol shall not take place without this wording and the wording shall remain in place whilst the punt is covered by a premises licence. Supply of alcohol can only take place when the name of the current licence holder is written on the punt. All wording must be removed immediately the punt ceases to be covered by the premises licence.

4. The punt must not be used without the permission of the (designated premises supervisor) DPS and the licence holder. When not in use the punt must be securely moored by lock and chain. Any unauthorised use of the punt must be reported by the licence holder to the police within 24 hours of discovery and the licence holder must keep a record of the police reference number.
5. Apart from when trading food and drink (including alcoholic drinks) shall not be stored on the punt.

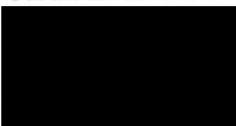

## **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -**
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or**
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.**
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.**
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.**  
**(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.**

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

**No adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children shall be permitted in the premises at any time.**

### **The prevention of crime and disorder**

- 1. All drinking vessels that are used to decant alcohol into shall be non glassware.**
- 2. With the exception of when full bottles of Wine and Champagne are purchased by customers alcohol shall be decanted from bottles into non glass drinking vessels by staff prior to being served to customers.**
- 3. No sales of alcohol shall be made from the punt whilst it is moored.**
- 4. A minimum pricing strategy shall be upheld to minimise binge drinking e.g. no happy hours or large quantity discounts.**
- 5. During licensing hours, alcoholic beverages shall be held within a covered container so as to prevent the occupants of other craft from trying to steal items of stock when passing.**

### **Public Safety**

- 6. The punt must not be used to carry fare-paying passengers or members of the public. Only the Premises Licence Holder and his employees or servants may be permitted to use the vending punt.**
- 7. When undertaking transactions with customers on board other boats, the Premises Licence holder must not cause an obstruction to navigation. The punt must be navigated in accordance with the Cam Conservators' byelaws.**
- 8. To prevent obstruction of the banks or towpath, loading and unloading of items of stock shall take place at a location other than the address of the premises.**
- 9. 'Responsible Drinking' notices shall be displayed and 'Drink Aware' material shall be distributed.**

### **The prevention of public nuisance**

- 10. Prior to the commencement of licensable activities, full details of the on-site storage facilities for trade waste, including waste for recycling shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Team Leader Environmental Protection (TLEP). Such details shall identify the specific positions of where wheelie bins, paladins or any other**

means of storage will be stationed and the arrangements for the disposal of waste. The approved facilities shall be provided prior to the commencement of the licensable activities hereby permitted and shall be retained thereafter unless alternative arrangements are agreed in writing by the TLEP.

11. All bottles and drinking receptacles provided by the Premises Licence Holder shall display branding that can clearly identify the Premises Licence Holder.

#### The protection of children from harm

12. Prior to the commencement of licensable activities, a copy of the Premises Licence Holder's Drug and Alcohol Policy shall be provided to the Cam Conservators in accordance with the Code of Practice for Commercial Punt Operators.

13. The DPS or relevant person shall actively operate a 'Challenge 25 policy'. This will include a voluntary agreement to only accept identity cards with a 'pass' accreditation; passports or photo ID driving licences; any National identity card as ruled by any British Court as a bona-fide recognised form of identification; or any future identification card as approved by central government; as bona-fide recognised forms of identification.
