I have been made aware of the application for a licence to sell alcohol, off sales (by the above) and was surprised notice has not been addressed, using the database, created by Pen Hird, for matters of public interest. The Mill Road Community Improvements Group is still registered.

The consistent view represented by residents' groups has been to limit the trading hours of all outlets on Mill Road, given the experience which led to its inclusion in the central Cumulative Impact Zone, the use of Section 30 (ASBAct 2003) and APEC negotiations with the Cambridge Police.

The 'relaxation' of licensing, as a social experiment, has not been borne out in relation to 'binge drinking' (especially in student dominated areas, where 24/7 socialising includes the right to vomit in the streets, witnessed on Friday night last, in this short stretch, after topping up, in the vicinity).

This leads to question the Licensing Department's understanding of 'adequacy' which the Magistrates abandoned, long ago, as a constraint on trade 'which should seek its own level, allowing market conditions 'free play'. It also raises questions of the definition of 'vicinity' in the context of impact.

The present approach to policy and policing provides multiple instances of inadequate control by licensees selling to the "already inebriated" and there has been evidence of absenteeism and poor attention to the regulation. A common cut off time, equal on all outlets, by the midnight watershed should be common policy if only to inhibit variants to gain advantage.

Without consideration of 'adequacy', present policy encourages 'beggar my neighbour' tactics and discount selling to maintain margins of profitability.

I fail to see The Hobby House application, already undercutting other shops with its soft drinks section, applying a different standard to alcohol (which has little in common with hardware); this is an attempt to cut a piece of the very profitable action action.

The application should be rejected on the four grounds specified in relation to the CI Zone.





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

I understand that the hardware shop "Hobby Home" at 28 Mill Road has applied for a license to sell alcohol from 08:00 to 23:00. As a resident of Mill Street I am very concerned by this and would like to object to this application for the following reasons:

- 1) Mill Road is a designated Cumulative Impact Zone precisely because we already have several outlets licensed to sell alcohol (e.g. Cambridge Wine Merchants, Nip In, Bacchanalia and Cambridge International Stores, not to mention several pubs in between and that's just this side of the bridge!!). We do not need another.
- 2) Recently we have had more problems with the troublesome street people (a longterm and well-known blight of our area), who congregate daily at Barnabas Church, the Salvation Army, the bus shelter opposite, Mill Road Cemetery and Petersfield Park. They are always drunk/high/both and are loud and foul-mouthed, staggering along the pavement and sometimes falling into the road. You can confirm with the police just how many times a week they have to deal with this nuisance, and as a mother with two young children it is very unpleasant to witness. The last thing we need is yet another alcohol outlet open very early to very late to both attract and then keep them in the neighbourhood.
- 3) The late night take-aways and fast food outlets on Mill Road attract a lot of night-time business into this area. As a direct consequence the residents of Mill Road and its surrounding residential streets already suffer more than their fair share of late night noise, litter and vandalism. Another shop selling alcohol until 23:00 is yet one more invitation to the types of people who cause these problems for us.
- 4) It seems odd that a hardware shop is applying to sell alcohol. I do not know of any other hardware shop that sells alcohol and I would question their motives.

In a residential area as densely populated as ours (with young families, students and elderly people among the residents) to grant this alcohol license sends out the wrong message, and I hope the application is rejected for all the reasons I have mentioned. Please keep me informed of the outcome. Thank you.



I am writing to very strongly object to plans by Hobby Home, at 28 Mill Road, to obtain a licence to sell alcohol.

Over many years Mill Road has suffered from anti social behaviour associated with excessive drinking. Things have recently improved, but there are still instances of drunken groups congregating in bus shelters and in the cemetery. It does not help that several of the institutions along Mill Road – especially Mickey Flynn's pool hall and the White Swan pub – appear to actively encourage excessive alcohol consumption.

Recently, there has been a concerted campaign by local residents' associations to restrict alcohol licenses and also for the introduction of a Cumulative Impact Zone in our neighbourhood. This covers the entire length of Mill Road, and recognises that there are already sufficient outlets for alcohol. However, it does not preclude new applications. This is a unfortunate oversight.


