N2	Campkin Road hanging baskets	4 hanging baskets for the lamp posts on Campkin Road opposite the shopping area.	Cllr Kevin Price	Kings Hedges	2,500	-	2,500	Low to medium risk project. Subject to suitability of existing lamp columns, testing and views of asset owner Balfour Beatty. Estimate includes for suitable brackets. Continuation in future years would require additional annual provision.
N3	Brimley Road verge reinforcement	Areas of verge along Brimley Road are suffering the effects of repeated vehicular over-run, including regular parking. This project would allow this to continue - retaining the grass where practicable, but strengthening the structure of the worst affected areas to reduce rutting and help the grass survive, as used elsewhere in the city with some success.	Cllr Mike Todd-Jones	Arbury	25,000	10,000	15,000	Low to medium risk project. A funded County Council LHI project requiring a Minimum (£1,000) 10% EIP contribution to proceed, plus any shortfall in spend above £11,000. Current project estimate £25,000. A lesser spend would be possible, addressing those areas most in need. Similar to an EIP bid (3) considered last year.

N4	Halingway Drove way resurfacing	Improve muddy path between the East Chesterton Halingway & Fen Road. Resurface with same surface type as Halingway.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	6,000	-	6,000	Low to medium risk project. This is a short but well-used route between Haylingway from Fen Road; with access at the Fen Road end being improved as an EIP/LHI project in 2013-14 (11). Improving the condition of the path should be technically relatively straightforward, but would require agreement, and approval, from landowners and other stakeholders.
N5	Sherbourne Close tree	Plant tree at entrance to Sherbourne Close to replace previous tree. Add flower display.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	3,000	-	3,000	Low to medium risk project. Unclear how previous tree became lost. City Council tree team supportive of suitable replacement, with suitable support/containment system as necessary, subject to stakeholder agreement.
N6	Fallowfield Green replanting	Replant area so there is a full line of bushes along edge of green. Use mature plants.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	5,000	-	5,000	Medium risk project. Potentially a difficult project to take forward at this time. However, there is a County Council Section 106 scheme proposed in this area, which may affect the possibilities here. Suggested that the outcome is determined before progressing this scheme.

N7	Chesterton Road near Elizabeth Way	Improvements to Chesterton Road near to Church Street, and either side of the signalled crossing of Elizabeth Way, to improve pedestrian and cyclist separation.	County Cllr Ian Manning	East Chesterton & West Chesterton	11,000	10,000	1,000	Low to medium risk project. A funded County Council LHI project requiring a 10% (£1,000) EIP contribution to proceed.
N8	Frank's Lane railings	Put a knee high guard rail around the side of the cut-through from Fallowfield to prevent cyclists etc. cutting across the drive way of 48 Fallowfield.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	5,000	-	5,000	Low risk project. Work has been undertaken here previously to improve visibility and reduce the likelihood of conflict. A better solution might be a small area of kerb edged low level planting as an extension to, and in line with, the mature hedge bounding one side of the passageway.
N9	Halingway green protection	Change the 'tree line' by planting some more white willows on the towpath between Peter's Posts/bus stop and the section where the path splits into two as it is becoming seriously eroded and compacted.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	5,000	-	5,000	Medium risk project. The suitability of, and support for, planting trees here, along with suitable support/containment system as necessary, would require establishing - as would the views of landowners (eg Cam Conservators) and other stakeholders. Alternatively, other options to address the issue might be considered.

N10	High Street to Scotland Road cut-through	Commission some art work along the floor, with a Chesterton theme, preferably from local (to East Chesterton) artists. Repair broken surfaces.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	10,000	-	10,000	Medium risk project. Art element hard to appraise, but the bid suggests £5,000 be allocated to this aspect. Limited repairs to the path surfacing might be undertaken within the estimate indicated.
N11	High Street by Haymakers Pub	Either replace missing bollards, add some extra bollards, or reconfigure junction to provide a cycle path as well as the pavement and road.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	1,000	-	1,000	Medium risk project. An additional bollard used to exist here beyond the one shown in the image below. It is not clear how this came to be removed; either through damage, or, to improve access. A suitable replacement, if deemed appropriate, might be provided for £1,000 or less. Subject to Highway Authority, and other stakeholder, agreement.
N12	Mariners Way	Improvements to separate pedestrian and cycle movements in Mariners Way on the east side of the Elizabeth Way bridge underpass.	County Cllr Ian Manning	East Chesterton	11,000	10,000	1,000	Low risk project. A funded County Council LHI project requiring a 10% (£1,000) EIP contribution to proceed. Similar to an EIP bid (12) considered last year.
N13	Carlton Way verge reinforcement	Areas of verge along Carlton Way are suffering the effects of repeated vehicular over-run, including regular parking. This project would allow this to continue - retaining the grass where practicable, but strengthening the structure of the worst affected areas to reduce rutting and help the grass survive, as used elsewhere in the city with some success.	Cllr Mike Todd-Jones	Arbury & West Chesterton	15,000	-	15,000	Low to medium risk project. Considered as an EIP bid (5) last year. A reserve in the County Council's LHI programme - however no firm contribution yet secured.

N14	Kinross Road dropped kerb	Provide an accessible dropped kerb on corner of access road to Stevenson House (near junction with Edinburgh Road).	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	2,000	-	2,000	Low risk project. Improves accessibility in this area. Complements benches provided close by as an EIP project (16) last year.
N15	Sherbourne Close dropped kerb and path improvements.	Level off uneven pavement in the direction of Green End Road. Drop the kerb directly outside 2 Sherbourne Court.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	5,000	-	5,000	Low to medium risk project. Less able road users in this area have some difficulty getting around and these straightforward improvements would help.
N16	Fallowfield to Frank's lane cut-through	Resolve problem that bollards prevent access to wide buggies, wheelchairs, etc. but still need to stop scooters etc using cut-through.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	2,500	-	2,500	Medium risk project. The form of access control would require careful development due to the constraints of the site and may have limited effect.
N17	Fallowfields planting	New planting in the small (tree pit?) areas to improve the general appearance of Fallowfields.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	22,000	-	22,000	Medium risk project. A similar project was considered as an EIP bid last year (9). The existing planting has disappeared over a period of years and any replacement would need careful development, and aftercare, to avoid the same fate. Alternatively, the areas might be removed and hardened.
N18	Ashfield Court replanting	Improve visual appearance of area by replanting green areas of Ashfield Court.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	5,000	-	5,000	Medium risk project. A similar project was considered as an EIP bid last year (18). Relatively straightforward improvement.

N19	Junction of Milton Road/Green End Road	Shared use path has heavy traffic and needs safety improvements to resolve poor visibility on blind corner (eg. mirror, land purchase).	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	8,000	-	8,000	Low to medium risk project. Considered as an EIP bid (14) last year. Some improvement might be effected by adjusting the route of the path and area of low planting on the corner to reduce the blind corner.
N20	Cam Causeway greening	Planting and/or grassing in build outs along Cam Causeway and possible verge protection.	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	20,000	-	20,000	High risk project. The existing verges are being eroded by vehicular over-run, including significant incidence of residents accessing unofficial off-street parking.
N21	Green End Road Rec park entrance	Make improvements to entrance to Green End Road recreation ground from Cam Causeway. 3 options: replace the current bollards with a gate and plant a large bush to block the open area; keep the current gate area and plant a bush to block the open area; or remove all the blocks and replace concrete path with green space (ie extend the park).	County Cllr Ian Manning & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	5,000	-	5,000	Low risk project. The existing entrance would best be widened to improve access, with the adjacent gap being closed.
N22	Church Street/High Street junction	Protection for grass on the left side (approaching from Church Street) of this junction to improve drainage and look of corner. Might include new low level planting or fencing.	County Cllr Ian Manning, Cllr Gerri Bird & former Cllr Susannah Kerr	East Chesterton	5,000	-	5,000	Low risk project. The same location is included as part of the LHI bid listed below as project N27. The bid is supported by Councillors from two groups.
N23	Ferrars Way dropped kerbs	Provision of additional accessible dropped kerbs adjacent to property numbers 22-36, to assist wheeled users crossing the road.	Cllr Carina O'Reilly	Arbury	6,000	-	6,000	Low risk project. Relatively low cost improvement also drawn to the attention of the County Council highways team.

N24	St. Giles War Memorial	Clean and repair war memorial.	Cllr Carina O'Reilly	Arbury	2,000		2,000	Medium risk project. The war memorial sits within the grounds of St. Giles church, fronting the Chesterton Lane junction at the foot of Castle Hill. A provisional sum is included for minor cleaning and identification of repairs needed, and there may be opportunity of additional contributions.
N25	North area ward dropped crossing improvements	A provisional sum for dropped crossing access improvements across the 4 North area wards, targetted towards local shopping and sheltered housing areas.	Cllr Gerri Bird	Arbury, Kings Hedges, East & West Chesterton	25,000	-	25,000	Low risk project. Provisional sum to drop kerbs in areas most in need; to be identified in conjunction with local councillors. Possible joint working with County Council highways team.
N26	Chesterton High Street	Pavement and kerbing improvements adjacent to the Tesco Express store.	Cllr Gerri Bird	East Chesterton	15,000	-	15,000	Low risk project. Provisional sum to improve the area(s) most in need. Area appears to be in reasonable structural condition, therefore it is unlikely to be a high priority for the County Council highways team.
N27	BrownsField and Bramblefield nature reserve - new benches	Provision of new benches at these two locations.	Cllr Gerri Bird	East Chesterton	2,500	-	2,500	Low to medium risk project. A new bench was considered for Bramblefields as an EIP bid (21) last year.
