#### Prevention Of Crime & Disorder / Public Nuisance / Public Safety

This is an application for Late Night Refreshment until midnight throughout the week and 0300 hrs Friday and Saturday in a residential area.

There is nothing within the applicants operating schedule of how he proposes to address the issue of drunken customers attending the premises to obtain food, the measures to prevent rowdy and noisy behaviour which in our view is an inevitable consequence of opening a fast food outlet until midnight in the week and 0300 hrs Friday & Saturday.

Cherryhinton Road is of the main pedestrian thoroughfares from the Cambridge Leisure site and is on the periphery of that Cumulative impact Area.

It is one of the main routes for patrons leaving the area on foot

At the times proposed the core of the potential customers are likely to be intoxicated and already worse the wear for drink, if not drunk. Those individuals are likely to be the main target audience for sales during the hours proposed for operation.

Experience shows us that when food take-aways outlets are operating when pubs and clubs are dispersing, a significant amount patrons wish to avail themselves of food, which is clearly the applicant's intention. This however invariably leads to confrontations, assaults fights, general disorder and nuisance taking place in and around the premises. It also can be very intimidating for staff working in the premises.

It is particularly an issue in a road bordered on both sides by buildings where noise will bounce around particularly late at night near residential properties

The latest crime analysis found in City East Area Update for Dec 2010 in relation to Coleridge Ward where this application is situated states:

- Total crime in Coleridge Ward has remained stable compared to the previous period 307 to 306, and levels also remain similar to those experienced in the equivalent period last year (304).
- Levels of violent crime have remained at a similar level with 66 offences compared to 62 in the preceding months and 48 last year. Cherry Hinton Rd and the Leisure Park remains a hotspot for offences, many of which appear to be related to the night-time economy and consumption of alcohol. Most offences have been common assaults or assaults occasioning actual bodily harm.
- ASB in Coleridge Ward has decreased since the last period from 279 to 204 and is still below the levels seen last year of 239. Cherry Hinton Road has recorded 42 incidents of ASB which relate to alcohol related behaviour and rowdy nuisance behaviour by youths.

It is obvious to the police based on our knowledge and experience of the area that allowing the premises to trade where its main core of customers will be either "in drink ", intoxicated or drunk is likely to lead to an increase in crime and disorder taking place, especially in the absence of any preventative measures or deterrents such as such as, CCTV adequate staffing, dispersal etc.

#### Prevention Of Crime & Disorder / Public Nuisance/ Public Safety

There is also the issue of disturbance to nearby residents of customers congregating outside, and the noise and possible litter element attached to sales to them.

A late night food outlet also by its very nature also encourages people to congregate and remain in the area, rather than dispersing and leaving via local transport (taxis) or on foot etc.

Because of the above reasons the police believe that the granting of a late night refreshment licence at the location to the hours requested would have a negative impact on the licensing objectives, in particular, crime & disorder, public nuisance and public safety.

Furthermore the police believe that we would be failing in our obligation under Section 17 of The Crime and Disorder Act 1998 as amended when exercising functions to give due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that they reasonably can to prevent, crime, disorder anti-social and other behaviour adversely affecting the local environment, including the misuse of drugs, alcohol and other substances in its area.

Evidence adduced in support of such representations may comprise of, although not exclusively, first hand knowledge of officers involved in policing the area, statistical analysis of crime, disorder & incidents of anti social behaviour, as well as police records from the Command and control logs, police crime files, statements and/or CCTV footage.

The Polices view is that this application should be refused and the premises should operate to normal hours until a proven track record has been achieved, which shows that no adverse consequences that offend the licensing objectives will arise as a result of its use.

Should the committee however be minded to grant the application, the Police request that consideration be given to imposing the following conditions:

The Police believe that the following additional steps should be the minimum undertaken in order to promote the four Licensing Objectives:

#### The Prevention of Crime and Disorder -

A digital CCTV system with appropriate recording equipment will be installed, operated and maintained throughout the premises internally to cover all public areas with sufficient numbers of cameras as agreed with Cambridge Police. Images shall be retained for 31 days and made available to the police or authorised officer on reasonable request. The CCTV images will record and display dates and times, and these times will be checked regularly to ensure their accuracy with GMT.

Glassware or bottles are not to be supplied to customers.

#### Public Safety -

An incident book is kept on the premises and staff are trained in the completion of this. Incident reports containing the names and details of offenders will be passed to the City Cambac manager.

Regular health & safety risk assessments are carried out.

Patrons will be asked to leave in the event of a greater number of people congregating within the premises than is conducive to public safety.

Patrons will be actively discouraged from congregating outside the front of the premises.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance –
All doors and windows will be kept closed at night to prevent noise nuisance.
Music will not be played within the premises
Patrons will be asked to leave the premises quietly and with due consideration for neighbouring properties. Notices will be displayed in a prominent customer facing area to that effect.
If a delivery service is provided delivery drivers are to be instructed to enter and leave their vehicles quietly and considerately, and not to leave engines running, and to park considerately.
Patrons who frequent the premises and behave in a disorderly manner or regularly leave in a noisy fashion will be banned.
The Protection of Children from Harm –
Any children that frequent the premises during the hours when late night refreshment is provided must be in the company of an adult.


A planning restriction/condition has been imposed in respect of the above premises details of which are appended below:

I am writing on behalf of Rustat Neighbourhood Association and Rathmore and Cherry Hinton Road Residents Association to object to this licensing application

The application only relates to opening hours after 11.00pm. The premises are, of course, open well before 11.00 but our concerns only relate to late night opening hours. These are requested to be 11.00pm until midnight 5 nights a week and 11.00pm until 03.00am on Fridays and Saturdays.

We object to the premises staying open beyond 11.30pm.

We would draw your attention to the fact that a consistent approach has been made by the City Council, both Licensing and Planning, to applications for extended opening hours. This approach has been in existence for some 10 years and only breached, at Appeal with the Planning Inspectorate in the case of Nusha Bar at the back of the Leisure Centre square.

Thus, we believe it is fair to say that there is clear Council policy for this area in respect of opening hours and this reflects the opening time which were introduced at the time the Leisure Centre was opened.

I would ask you to note the comments of the Planning Inspector in respect of an application by Subway to extend opening hours. He said in the conclusion of his report

'Overall I consider that the proposed extension of opening hours will have an adverse effect on the living conditions of the occupiers of nearby residential properties as a result of noise and disturbance, and it is my conclusion that Condition 31 (which relates to opening hours) dated September 10 2000, is reasonable and necessary to protect the living conditions of nearby residents. For thee reasons given above, I conclude that the appeal should be dismissed'.

We acknowledge that this relates to a Planning application but argue that the reasoning equally should apply to a Licensing application.

We also recognise that this ruling applied to premises on the Leisure Centre, though ones which are quite close to Cherry Hinton Road. These are some 200 yards away from the Cyprus Kebab premises. However there are residential properties equally close to the Cyprus Kebab premises and we would argue that the area immediately surrounding this site is much more predominantly residential one than that immediately adjacent to Subway.

Furthermore some 3 years ago, the request of Luxa Sparkles (100 yards way further down Cherry Hinton Road) to open and sell food and alcohol beyond 11.30pm was rejected. So those premises now close at 11.30.

We do not believe that there are any grounds for changing this policy and approach. To do so would set an unacceptable precedent and we will be in danger of scrubbing out the line that has been drawn in the sand for the last 10 years. What grounds for rejection would there then be for subsequent licensing and planning applications for extended hours in this area? In the present economic climate, other nearby retail units may well also seek

extensions in an attempt to generate extra business, and potential new unit owners would use this as a precedent no doubt believing they too could get approval for extended hours. This could lead to a significant change in the character of the area.

While there are some tables inside the premises, the predominant use is as a take away, thus there is a high likelihood that any users will eat their purchases in the immediate vicinity of the premises, causing noise and probably litter.

We believe there is a very strong likelihood that a high proportion of the people who might use these premises after 11.30pm would be people who have been drinking, and many will be quite intoxicated. Indeed, by seeking to open until 3.00am, the owner is clearly targetting such people. Such people would, of course, be far more likely to be noisy; the potential for disturbances, disorder and anti-social behaviour would be a high.

Quite a number would use their cars to visit the premises and thus there will also be the noise of car doors banging and engines revving, both in the limited space in Cherry Hinton Road and in the southern end of Rustat Road.

We would also point out that these premises are right on the edge of a Cumulative Impact Zone.

Looking at the immediately neighbouring premises, the sandwich bar closes late afternoon. The Indian restaurant, Taj Tandoori, also next door, is primarily a restaurant, and, although it also does takeaway food, Indian food is not usually eaten nearby, but taken away in sealed containers to be eaten at home.

We believe that the closing time at Luxa Sparkles should be used as the comparator for these premises given their proximity and identical neighbourhoods. We therefore oppose the proposed opening hours and ask that they be limited to 11.30 on all 7 days in the week.

We also have some objections to the plans for illuminating the shop front but understand they are matters for Planning, not Licensing.

Subject to availability, we plan to attend and speak at the licensing committee meeting which deals with this application, and therefore ask that you notify us of the planned date
