P Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

#### a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

Staff are fully trained to ensure that the premises provides a safe environment for all that frequent, those who pass by or live in the surrounding area. By promoting responsible drinking and conscientious checking of ages and sobriety of the customers one would hope that the licensing objectives can be achieved. Staff and management will not tolerate underage drinking, violence, racism or drug use / selling, and all of these will be reported to police without exception. All areas of the premises will be fully supervised and any spillage of breakage will be cleared away immediately.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

All staff are fully trained in effective and responsible management and will be BII house members or greater.

Although pubs on King Street do not tend to operate a Pub watch scheme, staff will notify other bars of troublesome patrons and the staff from other bars do the same.

The staff operate a 100% zero tolerance to drugs and the use of drugs anyone caught will be reported to the police without exception and the other licensed premises on King Street will also be notified. Such patrons will be barred permanently from the premises. The bar layout does not provide secluded areas in which this could take place with out detection by staff.

Patrons that appear drunk will not be served alcohol but water will always be available. Staff will not operate any promotional drinking schemes or permit the consumption of alcohol in competition.

During opening hours the exterior of the premises will be illuminated by sign lighting and also street lighting.

The bar operates reasonable opening hours, and any patrons that appear to be under age will be required to provide an accredited form of identification prior to being served.

Alcohol will not be provided for take away unless in sealed containers and glass will be only allowed inside the premises.

#### c) Public safety

The property has a fully integrated fire alarm system with both illuminated alarms for the hearing impaired and sound alarms. There are currently two doors exiting the property and a third will be added, all of provide adequate disabled access and egress.

All fixtures and fittings in the premises are brand new and fully inspected. The layout of the bar, and associated seating and tables, allows the staff to maintain a full view of the entire premises and all patrons from behind the bar.

Patrons will be asked to keep glasses inside the premises but where necessary plastic glasses will be provided.

The customer profile is intended to be broad, King Street does not typically draw younger drinkers and by providing seating and limited standing area, and drinks of a sensible nature, the premises will aim to encourage patrons of all ages and backgrounds.

Effective staffing and management will also discourage 'binge' drinking / competitive drinking. The bar does not / will not sell alcohol aimed at young people intending to get inebriated. The bar sells beers, wines, cider and spirits in legal measures including half pints, 125ml wine glasses and 25ml spirit measures.

Staff will not sell alcohol to anyone who appears to be drunk.

Reasonable drinking up time will be allowed following the call of time so that customers are not forced to rush their drinks and exit the premises at the same time.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

The premises will maintain a strict operating schedule, with the aim of minimizing impact on the neighboring properties. The consumption of alcohol will be restricted to indoors only after certain times, and patrons will be asked to leave and arrive in a considerate manner. With the property benefitting from a rear yard which is unique for a pub on King Street, smokers will be encouraged to use this rather than using the pavement. This would considerably reduce the amount of alcohol being taken outside to the front of the property, therefore reducing noise levels. The doors to the bar are self closing, keeping noise levels to a minimum, and curtains will be closed at 22:30 to reduce light levels. Waste storage is provided in the rear court-yard. therefore litter will be effectively managed. Staff are also responsible for maintaining cleanliness outside the property. Ashtrays will be attached to the front of the property to reduce litter caused by smokers. Internally approximately 50% of the seating and tables are fixed to encourage customers to sit down this will also have the effect of restricting the capacity, and the bar design allows 360 degree views of the property from behind the bar. King street is well served by taxis and the buses run on a regular basis past the property, with bus stops within 200 yards. Staff will also telephone taxis for customers. The property will not have an impact on traffic during deliveries as these will be kept to a minimum and the highway is wide enough to allow vehicles to pass.

#### e) The protection of children from harm

From the pavement the property does not allow a clear view into the bar and serving area. Windows are etched to block the view. The current front doors will also be replaced with solid doors with a self closing mechanism to ensure view is obscured. Only accompanied children will be allowed to enter the premises during reasonable times, and any person who appears to be under the age of eighteen or those that are included in a group of which members may appear under eighteen will all be required to prove their age. Only acceptable forms of identification will be accepted and staff training will help promote this. On certain occasions no children will be allowed even accompanied by a responsible adult. Effective staff training and supervision will enable the best possible levels of protection, and ensuring that adequate staff levels are employed.
