Suitable bulbs, wild flowers or flowering shrubs might add year round interest whilst keeping maintenance requirements minimal. Investigate potential for community involvement with upkeep, to avoid adding to Council operating costs.
E2	Barnwell Road roundabout corner by bowls club green space improvements	Addition of a grassed earth mound to protect the area from parking, with improvements to planting and seating to help promote biodiversity and greater community use of valuable green space.	Abbey Ward Councillors	Abbey	8,000	Amber	8,000	Area is adopted public highway and contributes to visibility at busy junction. Will require support and agreement of County Council, with possible use of Traffic Regulation Order. Cost likely to exceed suggested £5,000 project ceiling.
E3	Dudley Road Recreation Ground addition of benches	Dudley Road Rec is a significant size and incorporates open green space, mature trees and play facilities. However, it lacks any seating which restricts inclusive usage. Locations to be determined through local engagement.

Will require support and agreement of County Council, with possible use of Traffic Regulation Order, and local residents. Cost could be considerable and may exceed suggested project ceiling.
E5	Wadloes Road verge planting	Maximise utilisation of green open space behind paths between entrances to Ekin Road and Dudley Road. Addition of benches, trees and wildflower meadows to encourage interest, dwelling and biodiversity.	Abbey Ward Councillors	Abbey	8,000	Amber	8,000	Ekin Road estate lacks open green space but the wide verge alongside Wadloes Road has considerable scope for enhancement. Area is adopted public highway and contributes to property access and visibility at busy junction. Will require support and agreement of County Council, with possible use of Traffic Regulation Order. Cost likely to exceed suggested £5,000 project ceiling.
E6	Whitehill Road verge protection	Verges suffering damage from vehicle parking by residents and on football match days. Better management, re-landscaping and potential small-scale reconfiguration could enable better use of valued amenity.	Abbey Ward Councillors	Abbey	10,000	Amber	10,000	Area is adopted public highway and contributes to property access and visibility at busy junction. Will require support and agreement of County Council, with possible use of Traffic Regulation Order. Cost likely to exceed suggested £5,000 project ceiling.

E9	Coleridge streets tree and verge protection	Extension of Perne Road verge and tree protection trial to Birdwood Road and similar adjacent streets.	Cllr L Herbert	Coleridge	10,000	Amber	10,000	A number of roads in the vicinity (including Birdwood Road and Chalmers Road) have required intervention works to verges arising from vehicular parking, and this proposal will support a more co-ordinated approach. Subject to resident support and approval from County highway authority.
E10	Petersfield ward streets window boxes	Scheme to offer window boxes to residences north of Mill Road lacking front gardens in order to help soften hard landscaped street-scenes.	Cllr R Robertson	Petersfield	10,000	Amber	10,000	A solution might be developed that offers collective environmental benefits, is revenue cost neutral to the Council and can be implemented in a manner that is acceptable to the County highway authority (must not impede footways).
E11	North Petersfield notice-boards	Provision of new community notice-boards near the primary school in Norfolk Street, and the Ainsworth Street/ Sleaford Street corner.	Local residents via Cllr R Robertson	Petersfield	3,000	Green	3,000	Provisional sum to enable suitable new notice-boards to be installed at each of these two locations.

E12	Petersfield Green planting beds and benches	Work to improve planting beds and benches to encourage use of open-space and reduce potential for anti-social behaviour.	Cllr R Robertson	Petersfield	5,000	Green	5,000	The existing open space perimeter planting beds date back approaching 20 years and, whilst they offer good screening from traffic, might be re-worked and opened up to promote visibility and encourage new growth. Bench locations, similarly, might benefit from review.
E13	Glisson Road trees and tree pits (top up existing scheme)	Extension of existing project for Glisson Road to enable establishment of trees at additional locations, should they prove viable.	Cllr R Robertson	Petersfield	5,000	Amber	5,000	£10,000 already allocated towards project by East Area Committee in January 2018, with project under development. Provisional sum to enable trees to be provided at up to 3 locations.
E14	Romsey 'insect hotels'	Provision of specific facilities to assist local biodiversity (for example bee hotels) at the corner of Mill Road with Coleridge Road, and at Romsey Recreation Ground.	Cllr A Smith	Romsey	2,000	Green	2,000	Such facilities are an effective way of enhancing local ecology, and have been funded via EIP elsewhere. Supported by Council Biodiversity Officer.
