## Written Questions – 13 September 2007

# 1. From Councillor Herbert to the Leader, Councillor Nimmo-Smith and/or the Executive Councillor for Climate Change & Growth, Councillor Reid

On what dates before mid-July 2007 did the Leader and/or the Executive Councillor for Climate Change and Growth have progress briefings or meetings on congestion charging or TIF-related issues involving

- a) county officers, or
- b) city officers,

and when was the city council first informed at a meeting or formally that the county preferences were

- i) for an 'area based' road pricing scheme?
- ii) for submitting its congestion charging proposals and TIF bid to Government in Autumn 2007?

## Reply from Councillors Nimmo-Smith and Reid

The table below sets out details of the meetings involving the Leader or Executive Member or both and City Officers at which TIF<sup>1</sup> and congestion charging issues have been raised for briefing and or discussion. It does not include: open meetings of the Joint Strategic Forum on which both parties were represented; and meetings arranged for stakeholders and cross party groups of members. In addition to the meetings identified below, TIF and congestion charging will have been mentioned during informal discussion and briefings between the Leader/Executive Member and City officers.

#### The table indicates that:

- 1. the Executive member was first briefed on the design of the scheme and the proposal for an area based scheme on 9<sup>th</sup> July 2007; and
- 2. the Executive member was first briefed on accelerated timetable for the submission of TIF on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2007.

<sup>1</sup> The initial exploratory bid for TIF and the big strategic bid were progressed hand in hand. When the County bid for study money, government had already made it clear that there would be more (significant) money available later to bid for actually implementing schemes. The exact process (guidance, what would need to be in the business case etc) came out in the first quarter of 2007, but it had been made clear that it would do so. What has changed is that the County had originally intended to bid (if we chose to do so) towards the end of 2008, after the study had been completed and consulted upon, but subsequent events (in June 2007) convinced us of the need to bid earlier and consult afterwards, with the proviso that whatever was bid for could substantially change following the consultation.

### 2. From Councillor Newbold to the Executive Councillor for Environmental Services, Councillor C Rosenstiel

Can the Executive Councillor for Environmental Services confirm the projected tonnage of cardboard in year one tetrapack recycling that will actually get recycled, and the percentage of the total that will be shipped to Sweden for processing?

## Reply from Councillor C Rosenstiel

All of the cartons and tetrapak collected from the new banks installed by Tetrapak will be shipped to a mill in Sweden for recycling. It is difficult to give tonnage information as we have only been operating this service since the end of July 2007. Tetrapak calculate that 0.2% of the waste stream is made up of cartons, however the City Council's latest waste compositional analysis shows significantly more than this at 1%. It is calculated that bring banks can collect 10% of that available tonnage. Based on total waste arisings for Cambridge last year, tonnage for cartons could range from 9.3 tonnes to 46.6 tonnes per annum.

#### Detail of calculation

46,597x0.2% = 93 tonnes 10% of this as a capture rate from recycling banks = 9.3 tonnes 46,597x1% = 466 tonnes 10% of this = 46.6 tonnes

At present Cambridge City has 7 banks for cartons at 4 sites (Sainsburys, Tescos, Waitrose and the Beehive). These have been supplied by Tetrapak, who have subcontracted the emptying to a third party. Tetrapack are covering the cost of this service for a trial period of 2 years.

Between 70 - 90% of a carton is cardboard. During recycling the aluminium foil and polyethylene are separated from the fibre, which is recovered to make new paper products.
