

Adoption Statement for the Eastern Gate Development Framework Supplementary Planning Document (Regulation 16 (2) and 19 of Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004) as amended

Cambridge City Council has adopted the Eastern Gate Development Framework Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) with effect from 4th October 2011. Any person aggrieved by the Eastern Gate Development Framework SPD may make an application to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision to adopt the SPD. Any such application for leave must be made promptly and in any event not later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted.

Title of Document: Eastern Gate Development Framework Supplementary Planning Document.

Subject Matter: The Eastern Gate Development Framework SPD sets out the City Council's redevelopment aspirations for the Eastern Gate area. It provides a framework that will co-ordinate and guide future redevelopment in line with the Council's Local Plan policies.

Area of Document: The Eastern Gate study area stretches from the Crown Court (East Road) and Elizabeth Way Roundabout to the beginning of the Cambridge Retail Park.
