While it aims to reflect the median wage, it doesn't always keep pace with the actual cost of living, particularly housing, food, and energy costs. It inflation outpaces the NLW increase, low-income households could see their real-term financial situation worsen, despite their council tax support going up. Not a Holistic Approach : The proposal only considers one factor: the NLW.
