The Committee made the following findings of fact:

- The applicant has provided measures on how they intend to promote the four licensing objectives, with requested changes.
- Collections to be restricted to 5 per week. No HGV collections.
- Orders to be made on-line only.
- Delivery access backs onto road.
- CCTV and security fixtures being installed.
- Storage to be limited to 500 cans.
- Applicant to change operations to 3rd Party Fulfilment in due course as business grows.

The Committee resolved to GRANT the license

- Supply of alcohol (off the premises)
Monday – Sunday 00:00 to 23:59

WITH the additional Conditions that:

- I. the premises will not be open to the public
- II. Collections and deliveries in total to be restricted to 5 per week.
- III. No HGV collections
- IV. No collections or deliveries to occur at the premises between 20:00hrs and 08:00hrs

The reason for the Committee's decision are as follows:

- The applicant has provided measures on how they intend to promote the four licensing objectives, with requested changes.
- The applicant has agreed additional conditions to minimise any disturbance to local residents
