1.	Introduction
1.1	This report presents the current work programme of the Committee following the informal meeting in June 2026. Scrutiny should be a member-led process, and it is the role of committee members to decide which items they would like to add to the work programme. When thinking about potential topics, it is suggested that members consider the PAPER mnemonic: Public Interest – is this a matter of interest / relevance to residents? Ability to Change – is this an area where scrutiny can have a meaningful impact? Performance – is this an area where the council or local service providers are underperforming or one where there is a policy gap? Extent – does the item effect the whole – or a large part – of the district? Replication – is scrutiny replicating work going on elsewhere or is it an issue that has recently been considered by the committee? Members should also think about the core functions of scrutiny: Holding the Executive (Cabinet) to Account, Policy Development and Review, Performance Monitoring and External Scrutiny.
